I have been a Registered Nurse since 1986. I am a graduate of the Washington University in St Louis Jewish Hospital School of Nursing. I am certified for advanced practice in Oncology. I have worked at Texas Health Resources Arlington Memorial since 1992. During my time there I have worked primarily Oncology. During Covid I transitioned temporarily to the Emergency Room Triage to meet the needs of the hospital. I am currently the Primary Nurse of our Outpatient Transfusion Department. I was part of the first wave of staff administering the Covid Vaccination.
